With the sun setting, Mark suggested a parade through the house. Instruments made from pots and spoons clanged rhythmically, making everyone smile and join the festivity.


As evening fell, Mark's final rule was a storytelling hour. Everyone took turns sharing a story filled with wonder, where even Mark listened with big, bright eyes.
